Most of today's nearly two million street kids come from abusive parents, who usually do not report their children's absences. Once on the street, their need for shelter, food, clothing and protection becomes a matter of survival.

Since 1990, STANDUP FOR KIDS, through its national network of volunteers, has been walking the streets to rescue, educate and involve homeless and at-risk youth. We have seen kids begging for money. What is STANDUP FOR KIDS?

STANDUP FOR KIDS is a national, not-for-profit organization founded in 1990 to help rescue homeless and at-risk youth living on the street. With national headquarters in Denver, Colorado, STANDUP FOR KIDS has established ten outreach programs in five states.

What is the purpose of STANDUP FOR KIDS?

Simply put, the purpose of STANDUP FOR KIDS is to empower homeless and at-risk youth toward life-long personal growth through a national on-the-streets outreach program, and to create in these youth a sincere caring and belief in themselves through open, straightforward counseling and educational programs, thereby helping them acquire the life skills necessary to become effective members of their community.

What is the target population for STANDUP FOR KIDS?

We target homeless and at-risk youths age 21 and younger.

Does StandUp For Kids have a religious or political affiliation?

No, STANDUP FOR KIDS is an independent, not-for-profit organization that has no religious or political affiliation. STANDUP FOR KIDS actively seeks to help kids without regard to race, religion, sexual orientation, nationalities, cultures, and backgrounds.

How does STANDUP FOR KIDS operate?

STANDUP FOR KIDS is an all-volunteer operation. We have no paid staff members. Typically, volunteers are professionals who dedicate evening and weekend hours to walking the streets. Volunteers fill a variety of positions -- such as executive director, public relations manager, community resource director, outreach and apartment support directors, and kid and adult training directors. Since 1990, STANDUP FOR KIDS volunteers have performed more than 300,000 hours of service and conducted more than 25,000 counseling sessions.
